The World of Barbara Loden

'I don't want to get into the system as it exists, I want to create my own corner.' Barbara Loden

Visionary American independent actor-writer-director Barbara Loden is seen anew, not only through her extraordinary feature, the proto-feminist road film *Wanda*, but her wider career, writes season curator **Elena Gorfinkel**.

Barbara Loden is best known as the director, writer and star of the 1970 US independent road movie *Wanda*. A stunning work made on the cusp of feminism's second wave, and Loden's only feature as a filmmaker, it considers a wanderer who abandons her life as a miner's wife and mother, electing to drift through America, taking up with several terrible men. Long difficult to see, *Wanda* has recently gained cult status, emblematic of all the films by women that remain unknown and unseen. This programme takes a deep dive into Loden's larger film career, creative process and influences.

It explores her work as an actor and director in Hollywood, as well as on its margins, alongside *Wanda's* cultural, industrial and social contexts. Loden's life and work open a portal onto 1970s American cinema, replete with 'mad housewives' and wayward drifters, and to a moment of feminist urgencies, revealing the stakes of women's creative labours. The constellation of *Wanda's* genealogies and Loden's legacies continue to inspire generations of filmmakers, writers and artists.

Wild River

Montgomery Clift stars as a New Deal-era bureaucrat tasked with evicting tenants from their land for a hydroelectric dam project in the Tennessee River Valley. An octogenarian matriarch refuses to relinquish her island property in the name of 'progress', as romance

develops between the government agent and her granddaughter. Shot on location, Kazan's Chekhovian Cinemascope staging of tradition versus modernity also features Barbara Loden in her first small film role. Contains racist views

Splendor in the Grass

USA 1961. **Director** Elia Kazan. **With** Warren Beatty, Natalie Wood, Pat Hingle, Barbara Loden. 124min. **35mm**. A BFI National Archive print. 15

A tale of unfulfilled teenage desire set in Kansas circa 1928, Elia Kazan's hothouse parable (with an Academy Award winning screenplay by playwright William Inge) examines the toll of Puritanical social propriety and sexual repression on high-school sweethearts: Bud Stamper, the child of oil wealth (Beatty's Hollywood debut) and the fragile Deanie. Loden's tempestuous role as Bud's wild flapper sister Ginny provides a prominent foil for the film's critique of judgmental small-town mores. Contains sexual violence, mental health issues, suicide

Made on the rocky Moab set of the Terence Stamp western *Blue, Fade In* concerns a budding and unlikely city-country romance between a film editor (Loden's first leading role) and a Utah rancher. After editorial meddling by Paramount, this film became the first pseudonymous 'Alan Smithee' vehicle, shelved until a TV debut in 1973. Due to its unusual production history, this is a rare opportunity to see this film on the big screen.

The Rain People

USA 1969. Director Francis Ford Coppola. With Shirley Knight, James Caan, Robert Duvall. 101min. Digital 4K. 12A Upon realising she is unexpectedly pregnant, young Long Island housewife Natalie flees with her husband's station wagon. Along the way, she picks up ex-high school football player 'Killer', who incurred a brain injury

on the field and who is en route to a slim promise of work in West Virginia. Coppola crafts a mournful New Hollywood tale of dissociated social misfits seeking a route to self-understanding.

USA 1970. Director Frank Perry. With Carrie Snodgress, Richard Benjamin, Frank Langella. 95min. Digital. 15 Based on a 1967 novel by Sue Kaufmann, with a screenplay adapted by Eleanor Perry, this film signalled for film critics an early 1970s micro-cycle of feel-bad dramas about women's dissatisfaction as wives, lovers and mothers. Constantly hectored and abused by her unbearable lawyer husband, Tina seeks out a lover in a dashing writer, who treats her with his own brand of misogyny and scorn. The film's satirical bourgeois hyperbole sits just askance of a pressing social reality.

A Woman Under the Influence

USA 1974. Director John Cassavetes. With Gena Rowlands. Peter Falk, Fred Draper. 147min. 35mm (restoration). 15 Wife to construction foreman and mother of three children. Mabel Longhetti moves to the beat of her own peculiarity. Rowlands gives an astounding performance of a woman's disintegration – a harrowingly human and deeply felt representation of emotional breakdown. It's a radiant assertion of a woman's insistence on the integrity of her self-image against a society and system that seeks only to pathologise her.

Across non-fiction and avant-garde film, women on the cusp of the feminist movement's second wave began to analyse the problems they faced in their daily lives. These three films embodied an emergent collective feminist voice using distinct strategies: collage, disruption and self-narration. These incendiary films diagnosed and illuminated women's shared oppressions through agitational montage of glossy advertising images and housework's unglamorous muck in Schmeerguntz, and and strategies of feminist consciousness-raising in The Woman's Film and Janie's Janie.

Los Olvidados The Young and the Damned

Mexico 1950. **Director** Luis Buñuel. **With** Alfonso Mejía, Stella Inda, Miguel Inclán, Roberto Cobo. 88min. Digital (restoration). EST. 12A

Fusing social realist and surrealistic elements, Buñuel's film unflinchingly portrays the lives of a gang of juvenile delinquents on the destitute streets of Mexico City, led by the ruthless Jaibo. Edging towards neorealism but devoid of its sentimentalism, Buñuel zeroes in on the brutalities of life lived in poverty without any reprieve. It ranked among Barbara Loden's favourite films.

A group portrait in split-screen achieved through double-projection, the Factory's habitues and glittering superstars hypnotically monologue and playact themselves for Andy Warhol's camera in the Chelsea Hotel. Comprised of twelve unedited 16mm reels, four in colour and eight in black and white, *The Chelsea Girls* oscillates between scripted and improvised elements, as the faces, gestures, and eccentric personalities of the 1960s New York demimonde come into resplendent view.

Sisters of the Gion Gion no Shimai

Japan 1936. **Director** Kenji Mizoguchi. **With** Isuzu Yamada, Yoko Umemura, Benkei Shiganoya. 69min. **35mm**. EST. U

Made directly after the production of his Osaka Elegy, Mizoguchi's tale of two geisha sisters in the Gion pleasure district of Kyoto in the 1930s details the struggles of the cynical and modern Omocha and the duty-bound Umekichi. Their contrasts evoke not only two different philosophies of geisha life amidst their struggles with debt, class hierarchy and misogynistic exploitation, but also gives view of a society endemically hostile to women's autonomy.



Mouchette

France 1967. **Director** Robert Bresson. **With** Nadine Nortier, Jean-Claude Guilbert, Maria Cardinal. 78min. Digital 4K. EST. 15

Robert Bresson's bleak, ineffable portrait of 24 hours in the life of 'little fly' evades platitudes of redemption. A 14-year-old girl is blighted by her environment: an ill mother, infant brother, an abusive father, alcoholism, social ostracism, isolation. Bresson's minimalist approach to the depredations faced by Mouchette produces a sublimely haunting image of inveterate cruelty and bitter circumstance.

Vagabond Sans toit ni loi

France 1985. Director Agnès Varda. With Sandrine Bonnaire, Macha Meril, Stephane Freiss. 107min. Digital. EST. 15

Bonnaire gives an indelible portrayal, presented through a series of flashbacks, of a wandering woman who has refused all the comforts of bourgeois convention, to drift 'without roof or law', hitching across the frozen vineyards, windy fields and small roads of Southern France.

Varda's invention of Mona, like Loden's Wanda, fuses elements of fact and fiction into an evocation of an uncompromising life lived with fierce self-determination and in a state of precarity.

Queen of Diamonds

USA 1991, Director Nina Menkes, With Tinka Menkes, 77min. Digital, 15

Menkes' arrestingly oneiric fugue of a film centres the character of Firdaus (played by her sister and frequent collaborator Tinka), a taciturn Las Vegas casino blackjack dealer who spends her days working and killing time. Menkes' trancelike aesthetic of striking tableaus disorient - whether of parched desert, neon's corrupted decadence, or mundane ritual - all the while critiquing the hidden violence that lurks beneath.



River of Grass

USA 1994. Director Kelly Reichardt, With Lisa Bowman. Dick Russel, Michael Buscemi, Larry Fessenden. 75min. Digital, 15

Describing her first feature as a 'road movie without the road, a love story without the love, and a crime film without the crime', Reichardt's couple-on-the-run caper is set in the Florida Everglades of her adolescence. Cozy, a bored housewife, whose laconic voiceover narrates the film, meets Lee, a hapless ne'er-do-well at a bar. Propelled by accident - a lost gun and a stray gunshot - they ricochet towards a botched fantasy of the outlaw life.

Milla

France-Portugal 2017. Director Valérie Massadian. With Severine Jonckeere, Luc Chessel, Ethan Jonckeere. 128min. Digital. EST Milla traces the conditions of survival of a 17-year-old girl and her boyfriend Leo, as they glean a life on the margins, sleeping in cars and squatting in temporary shelter, as she faces motherhood. Like Loden's Wanda Goronski, Massadian's working-class subjects, played by

non-professionals, have been 'given no chance' by a society that thrives on class inequality. The filmmaker bestows these young vagabonds with a gaze of deep care and reverence.
